Supporting Childcare Entrepreneurs

The California Women's Business Centers Network (CA WBC) drives the startup and expansion of childcare businesses and creates childcare jobs across the state. Childcare businesses are essential for economic stability, ensuring parents—especially women—can fully participate in the workforce. Yet, California faces a shortage of available childcare.

Funding from the WBC-Enhancement Program and the Governor's Office has enabled this year over year increase and expansion of childcare slots. However, despite significant economic impact and job creation, current budget constraints threaten future support for CA WBC Network's funding in general, including for childcare businesses.

Sustained funding is critically needed to ensure all entrepreneurs can launch licensed childcare programs and existing childcare business owners can expand and hire—in both urban and rural communities.
